Your next stop is the Red Brick Arts Centre & Museum in Edson. It is one of the oldest buildings in the Town of Edson built in 1913. It has been restored and is maintained by a

group of very dedicated individuals passionate about keeping the history of Edson alive. The Red Brick houses a School Room and Principal's Office Museum with many original features and houses a permanent display of historic school and local artifacts. Be sure to visit the Gallery to see a display of local Art work. Wander the halls to see our Permanent Art Collection and visit the Gift Shop.

Continue your historic journey down the Yellowhead with a visit to the Galloway Station Museum in Edson.

Start by taking an up close, interactive look at cougars, wolverines, grizzlies and many more species that roam the foothills of West-central Alberta. From there, explore the pioneer spirit through stories that tell tales of strength, perseverance and ingenuity and are displayed through interactive exhibits and historical artifacts. Located at 223 - 55 St. Edson, in RCMP Centennial Park between Highway 16.



The next stop on your journey down the Yellowhead is the Northern Rockies Museum of Culture and Heritage.

The Northern Rockies Museum of Culture & Heritage is Hinton's newest attraction, located in one of Hinton's oldest buildings. Take a step back

in time as you walk through the 1911 Railway Station, try hands-on historical activities and meet our mascot-Pedley the pack horse. Stop by for a tour to see how we are transforming the past into today's experiences. 225 Gregg Ave, Hinton.

You've made it to the Rockies! Learn more about the area at the Jasper-Yellowhead Museum & Archives.

The museum is made up of three galleries:

The Fred Kofin Gallery includes exhibits on the fur trade, the railways, early tourism, the park and its warden service, as well as the history of the town of Jasper itself. The exhibits in our Showcase & Alcove Galleries change several times a year.
